Overview

On June 4, 2024, the Orange County Transportation Authority released a request for proposals for security systems service and maintenance. Proposals were received in accordance with the Orange County Transportation Authority's procurement procedures for professional and technical services. Board of Directors' approval is requested to execute an agreement for security system service and maintenance.

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5. OC Streetcar Passenger Safety and Security

Overview

The Orange County Transportation Authority is responsible for the operations and maintenance of the OC Streetcar. A significant component of the operations and maintenance will be the passenger safety and security. Utilizing industry best practices and examples of similar systems, staff has developed a passenger safety and security framework tailored to the specific needs of the OC Streetcar. Board of Director's approval is requested to further develop a transit ambassador program and negotiate an amendment to the current contract with the Orange County Sheriff's Department.

Federal Transit Administration Program of Projects for Federal Fiscal Year 2023-24 Jason Huang/Kia Mortazavi

Overview

The Orange County Transportation Authority annually prepares a program of projects to secure Federal Transit Administration formula grants for transit capital projects, capitalized cost of contracting, and preventive maintenance. The federal fiscal year 2023-24 program, including amendments to prior programs, is presented for Board of Directors' review and approval.

- A. Approve the federal fiscal year 2023-24 Federal Transit Administration Section 5307 Urbanized Area Formula, Section 5310 Enhanced Mobility of Seniors and Individuals with Disabilities, Section 5337 State of Good Repair, and Section 5339 Bus and Bus Facilities Program of Projects, including federal and local funds, and the use of match credit for projects included in this report.
- B. Approve changes to funding for Preventive Maintenance and Capital Cost of Contracting in prior federal fiscal years for Federal Transit Administration, Section 5307 Urbanized Area Formula Program of Projects, including federal and local funds, and the use of match credit for projects to comply with guidelines for use of the funding.
- C. Approve the five-year programming plan for Federal Transit Administration Section 5307 Urbanized Area Formula, Federal Transit Administration Section 5310

Enhanced Mobility of Seniors and Individuals with Disabilities, Federal Transit Administration Section 5337 State of Good Repair, and Federal Transit Administration Section 5339 Bus and Bus Facilities.

- D. Authorize staff to adjust individual project funding consistent with final apportionments and eligibility determinations through the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act, and direct staff to include updated numbers in grant and programming status reports.
- E. Authorize the Chief Executive Officer, or his designee, to submit the Federal Transit Administration grant applications that are required for the recommendations above to the Federal Transit Administration.
- F. Authorize staff to process all necessary amendments to the Federal Transportation Improvement Program and execute or amend all necessary agreements to facilitate the above actions.

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11. 91 Express Lanes Update for the Period Ending - June 30, 2024

Overview

The Orange County Transportation Authority has owned and managed the operations of the 91 Express Lanes since January 2003. Since then, traffic volumes and toll revenues have fluctuated with changes in the economy and the added capacity to the State Route 91 corridor. Over the last quarter, approximately 5.6 million trips were taken on the 91 Express Lanes in Orange County. This report focuses on the operational and financial activities for the period ending June 30, 2024.

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12. Amendments to the Cooperative User Fee Processing Agreement for Interoperable Toll Processing and Revenue Collection

Overview

The Orange County Transportation Authority entered into cooperative user fee processing agreements with other California toll agencies to facilitate the interoperability process for toll collection. The agreements established a reciprocal arrangement for the exchange of data and establishes a settlement process for the exchange of funds between the toll agencies. Board of Directors' approval is requested to amend the cooperative agreements to incorporate the 405 Express Lanes into the cooperative agreements.

- A. Authorize the Chief Executive Officer to negotiate and execute Amendment No. 1 to Cooperative Agreement No. C-6-1532 between the Orange County Transportation Authority and Bay Area Toll Authority to incorporate the 405 Express Lanes into the cooperative agreement.
- B. Authorize the Chief Executive Officer to negotiate and execute Amendment No. 7 to Cooperative Agreement No. C-4-1113 between the Orange County Transportation Authority and San Diego Association of Governments to incorporate the 405 Express Lanes into the cooperative agreement.

13. Amendment to Agreement for Bus Stop Maintenance

Overview

On October 25, 2021, the Orange County Transportation Authority Board of Directors approved an agreement with ShelterClean Services, Inc., for a three-year initial term with two, two-year option terms, to provide ongoing preventive and corrective maintenance at each of the Orange County Transportation Authority's bus stop locations. The initial term expires on November 30, 2024. An amendment is required to exercise the first two-year option term for continued preventive and corrective bus stop maintenance.

Recommendation(s)

Authorize the Chief Executive Officer to execute Amendment No. 2 to Agreement No. C-1-3408 between the Orange County Transportation Authority and ShelterClean Services, Inc., in the amount of \$1,306,231, to exercise the first two-year option term of the agreement effective December 1, 2024 through November 30, 2026 for continued bus stop maintenance. This will increase the maximum obligation of the agreement to a total contract value of \$3,200,331.

14. Amendment to Cooperative Agreement with the California Department of Transportation for the Interstate 5 Improvement Project Between Alicia Parkway and El Toro Road

Overview

On November 11, 2019, the Orange County Transportation Authority Board of Directors approved a cooperative agreement between the Orange County Transportation Authority and the California Department of Transportation for construction capital and construction support services for the Interstate 5 Improvement Project between Alicia Parkway and El Toro Road, which is Segment 3 of the Interstate 5 Improvement Project between State Route 73 and El Toro Road. Board of Directors' approval is requested to amend the cooperative agreement for additional funding for construction capital and construction support services.

Recommendation(s)

- A. Authorize the Chief Executive Officer to negotiate and execute Amendment No. 3 to Cooperative Agreement No. C-9-1600 between the Orange County Transportation Authority and the California Department of Transportation, in the amount of \$18,980,000, for additional construction capital for the Interstate 5 Improvement Project between Alicia Parkway and El Toro Road. This will increase the maximum cumulative obligation of the cooperative agreement to a total contract value of \$181,065,000.
- B. Authorize the use of up to \$18,980,000 in Measure M2 funds for the construction phase of the Interstate 5 Improvement Project between Alicia Parkway and El Toro Road.
- C. Authorize staff to process all necessary amendments to the Federal Transportation Improvement Program and execute or amend all necessary agreements to facilitate the above actions.

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15. Amendment to Cooperative Agreement with the California Department of Transportation for the Interstate 605/Katella Avenue Interchange Project

Overview

On April 10, 2023, the Orange County Transportation Authority Board of Directors approved a cooperative agreement between the Orange County Transportation Authority and the California Department of Transportation for construction capital and construction management support for the Interstate 605/Katella Avenue Interchange Project. Board of Directors' approval is requested to amend the cooperative agreement for additional funding.

Recommendation(s)

- A. Authorize the Chief Executive Officer to negotiate and execute Amendment No. 1 to Agreement No. C-3-2384 between the Orange County Transportation Authority and the California Department of Transportation, in an amount of \$3,340,000, for additional construction capital and construction management support, for the Interstate 605/Katella Avenue Interchange Project. This will increase the maximum cumulative obligation of the cooperative agreement to a total contract value of \$30,460,000.
- B. Authorize the use of an additional \$3,340,000 in Measure M2 funds for additional construction capital and construction management support for the Interstate 605/Katella Avenue Interchange Project.
- C. Authorize staff to process all necessary amendments to the Federal Transportation Improvement Program and execute or amend all necessary agreements to facilitate the above actions.

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16. 2024 Measure M2 Sales Tax Forecast

Overview

The Orange County Transportation Authority contracts with MuniServices, LLC and three universities to forecast Measure M2 taxable sales. MuniServices, LLC and the three universities have each provided updated forecasts and staff have incorporated the new information into the annual update for the long-range forecast of Measure M2 taxable sales.

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17. Environmental Mitigation Program Endowment Fund Investment Report for June 30, 2024

Overview

The Orange County Transportation Authority has developed a Natural Community Conservation Plan/Habitat Conservation Plan, acquired conservation properties, and funded habitat restoration projects to mitigate the impacts of Measure M2 freeway programs. The California Community Foundation manages the non-wasting endowment required to fund the long-term management of the conservation properties. Each quarter, the California Community Foundation publishes a comprehensive report detailing the composition of the pool and its performance.

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18. Potential Refunding of the Measure M2 Sales Tax Revenue Bonds, Series 2010A (Taxable Build America Bonds)

Overview

The Orange County Local Transportation Authority currently has \$250,000,000 in outstanding Measure M2 Sales Tax Revenue Bonds, Series 2010A (Taxable Build America Bonds). Due to the unique economics and associated risks of these bonds, staff is requesting approval to explore the potential refunding of the Series 2010-A Bonds.

- A. Direct staff to pursue the issuance and sale of bonds to refund the Measure M2 Sales Tax Revenue Bonds, Series 2010A (Taxable Build America Bonds).
- B. Authorize an exception to the three percent savings requirement, in accordance with the debt policy, and direct staff to proceed with the refunding if the savings are at least net neutral or greater.
- C. Direct staff to return to the Board of Directors for approval of the draft financing

documents required to issue and close the transaction.

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19. Approval to Release Request for Proposals for Public Outreach Services for the Interstate 5 Improvement Project from Interstate 405 to State Route 55

Overview

Staff is requesting Board of Directors' approval to release a request for proposals for public outreach consultant services for the Interstate 5 Improvement Project from Interstate 405 to State Route 55. These services are needed for community outreach efforts during the pre-construction and construction phases of the project. A draft request for proposals has been developed to initiate a competitive procurement process to retain a public outreach consultant.

Overview

In late 2016, the Orange County Transportation Authority Board of Directors awarded a design-build contract for the Interstate 405 Improvement Project. In mid-2017, a full Notice to Proceed was issued commencing all design and construction activities. With the Interstate 405 Improvement Project substantially completed and the 405 Express Lanes component in operations mode, the Orange County Transportation Authority has responsibilities of fulfilling the obligations and requirements of the funding and management agreements and state statutes. One key component required is the development of a 405 Express Lanes Expenditure Plan.

Recommendation(s)

Direct staff to develop principles to guide the establishment of a 405 Express Lanes Excess Toll Revenue Policy and Expenditure Plan and return to the Board of Directors for consideration and approval.
