
South Orange County Transportation Projects Update

 Transportation Corridor Agencies, State Attorney General, and environmental advocates sign a settlement agreement to eliminate the proposed State Route 241 toll road extension, known as the Green Alignment

April 2020


OCTA Commits to Supporting Three Key Projects

 Board direction to advance development of three key projects in collaboration with partner agencies and stakeholders

October 2021 OCTA, County of Orange, and City of San Clemente Agree to Support the Three Key Projects

- Los Patrones Parkway Extension: Added to general plans and MPAH; M2 funding awarded for preliminary engineering
- Ortega Highway Widening: Funding agreements executed to support PS&E
- I-5 Carpool Lane Extension: Contract executed to develop a project report and environmental document

Key Roadway and Highway Projects

Ortega Highway Improvements (Caltrans)

- 1.1-mile widening from Calle Entradero to Reata Road removes a key chokepoint
- Final design underway by Caltrans 2026 completion
- \$71.6 million for right-of-way and construction phases
- Fully funded with construction planned to start in 2027

Los Patrones Parkway Extension (County and RMV)

- Approximately 3.9 miles and provides alternatives to adjacent corridors
- Preliminary engineering under way 2025 completion
- Construction cost: TBD
- Next steps: funding plan and final design

I-5 Carpool Lane Extension (OCTA and Caltrans)

- 3.5-mile project from San Diego County Line to Avenida Pico
- Environmental process underway 2025 completion
- Order of magnitude cost: \$400-\$450 million (not including mitigation costs)
- OCTA seeking grant funds for final design, right-of-way, and construction
