- Prepared environmental document for the SR-55 Improvement Project for public review
- AB 28 (Chapter 4, Statutes 2017) signed into law, reauthorizing Caltrans' authority for environmental approvals

- Completed FTA Risk Assessment Workshop on OC Streetcar's cost, schedule, and scope
- Closed out Sand Canyon Grade Separation project
- Secured California Environmental Quality Act clearance for Anaheim Canyon Metrolink Station

FTA – Federal Transit Administration





- Allocated \$32 million for 13 local agency streets and roads projects
- Updated the Board of Directors on Signal Synchronization Program
 - 59 corridors completed to date resulting in 13% savings in travel time
 - 29 corridors planned or underway





- Implementing agreement with resources agencies readied and the freeway program permit issuance anticipated - summer 2017
- First deposit for the Environmental Mitigation Program endowment took place
- 2017-18 call for projects totaling \$3.1 million for the Environmental Cleanup Program was approved





Challenges

- Negotiations on the TIFIA loan agreement for the I-405 Improvement Project
- Reduction of OC share in STIP funding and delays to previously programmed M2 projects
- Caltrans' strategic policy direction
