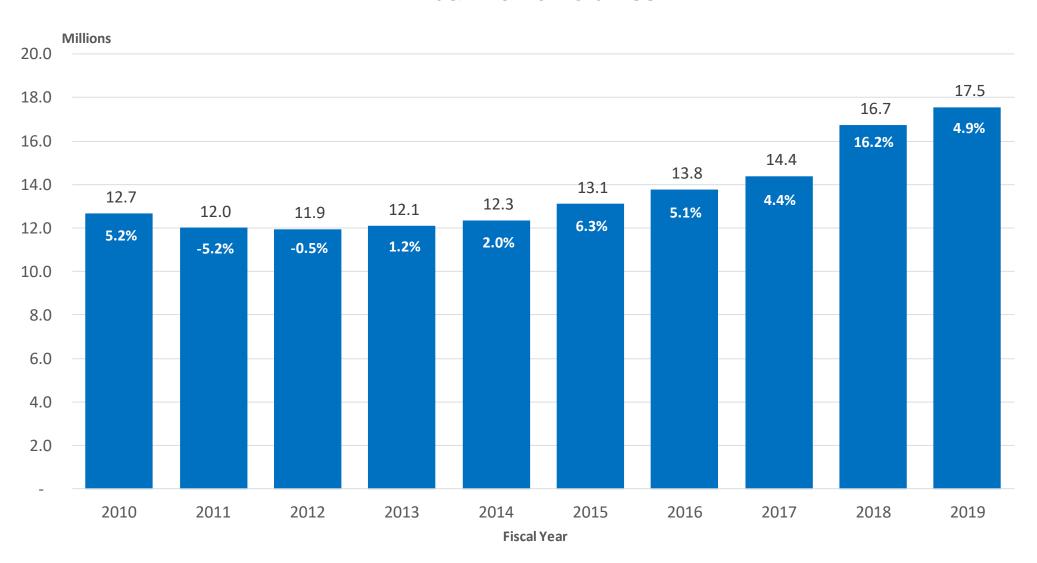


Recap of Fiscal Year 2019

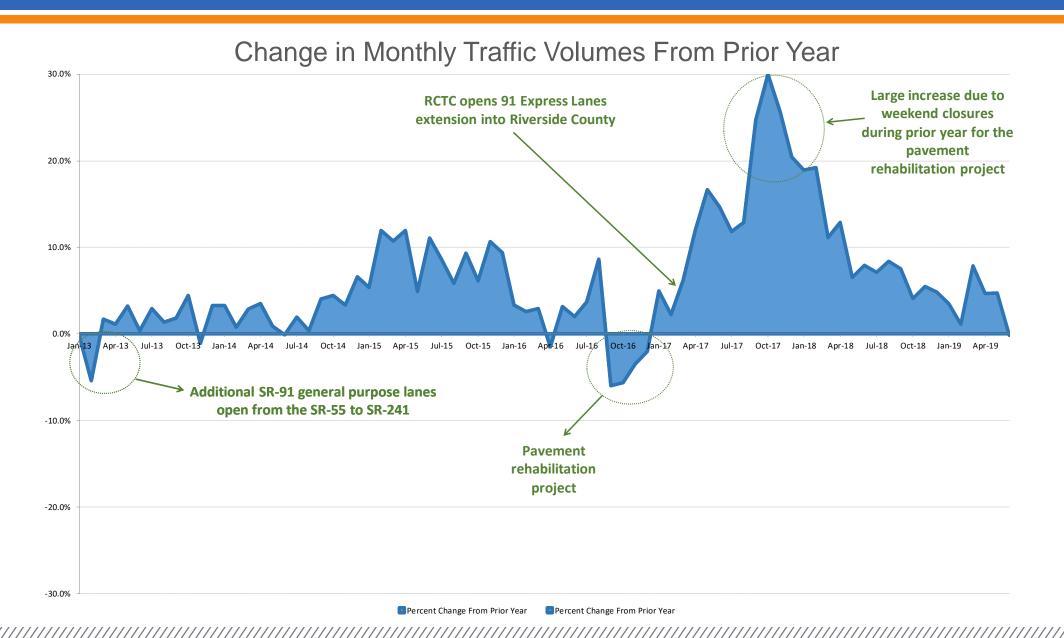
- Traffic volumes, toll revenues, and number of accounts reached historic levels

Annual Traffic Volumes

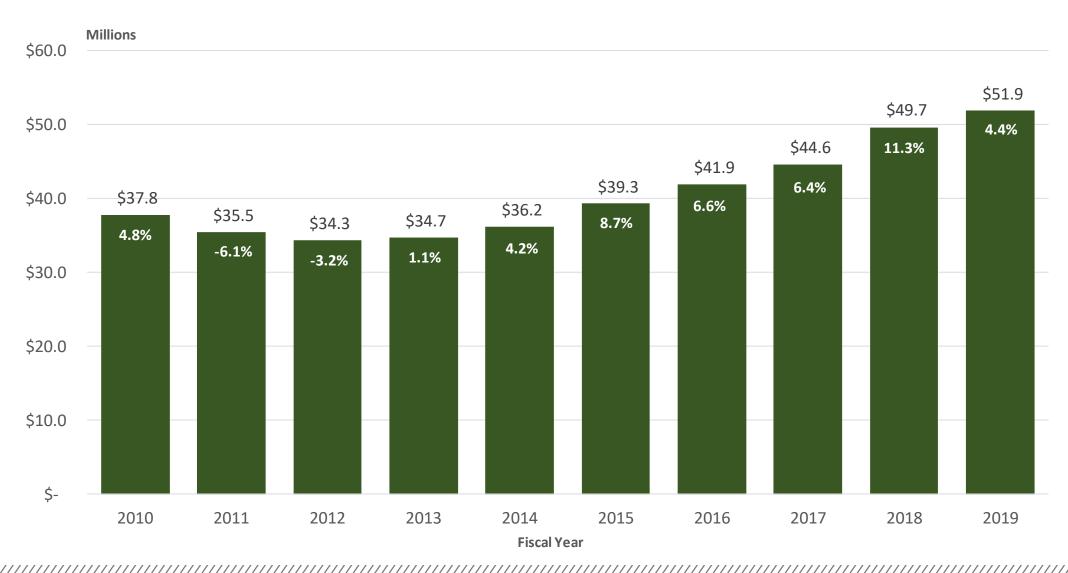

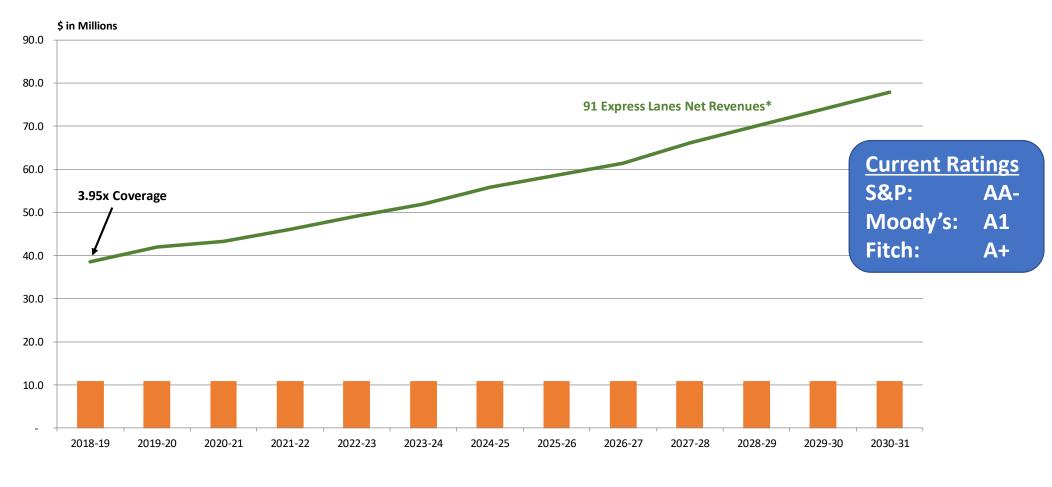
Toll Revenues Continue to Increase

Net Revenues Versus Annual Debt Service

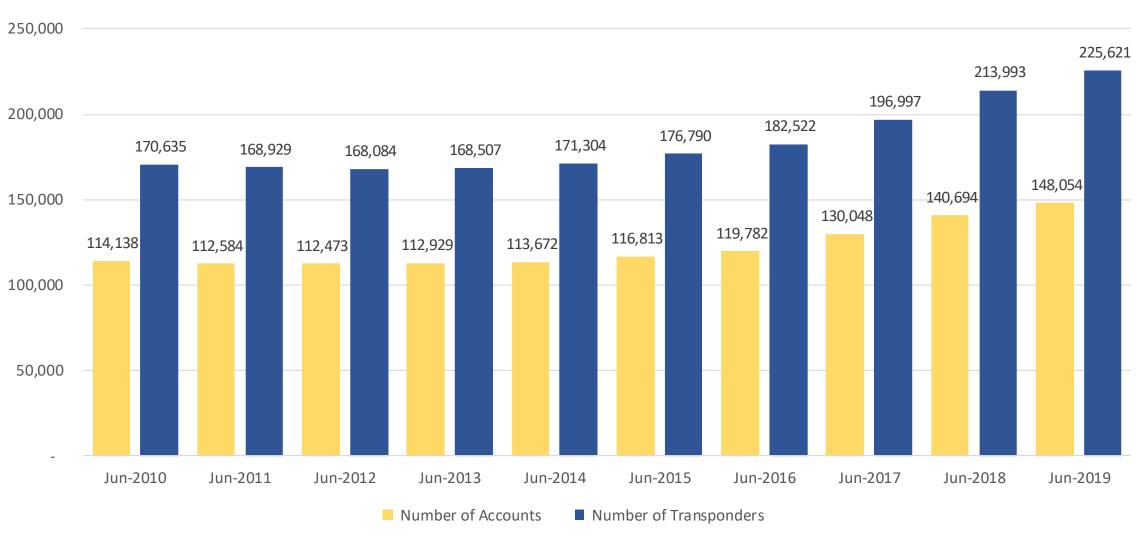
